PH 019**SWINDON BOROUGH COUNCIL – 20MPH INITIATIVE**

Councillor Hailstone presented a press article from June confirming the introduction of 20mph zones across Swindon. It was noted that no consultation had been made with the Parish Council. Councillors were asked to pass any ideas for potential zones for the Chief Officer to pass to the SBC Ward Councillors. The meeting discussed several areas of concern including Thames Avenue, Bryony Road, The Brow, Avonmead and Hamble Drive.

PH 020**SWINDON BOROUGH COUNCIL – PAVEMENT PARKING BAN**

Committee noted SBC's Policy Development & Scrutiny Committee – Build a Better Swindon report introducing a trial period (maximum 18 months) of restrictions on pavement parking. Ward Councillors will be invited to submit proposed areas within their Wards to be considered for the introduction of an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order to prohibit pavement parking. It was noted that in many areas pavement parking was an embedded behaviour, seen as the norm and that an overall shortage of parking spaces relative to the levels of car ownership in some areas could result in some negative impacts arising from any prohibition on pavement parking. Ward Councillors may have to demonstrate local support through surveys, petitions, questionnaires or socials as well as through the view of Towns and Parish Councils. Further consultation with SBC Ward Councillors is expected to take place.
