Background

The football skills workshops held each Monday evening for 6–11-year-olds in July were a huge success and were well attended each week. Allstarz is keen to run further sessions again later in the year, as are parents and young people. The Council has received some very positive feedback from members of the public regarding how well received this service was and how important it is for their children's mental health and well-being. Additionally, moving the venue from Trent Road to Mouldon Hill is being considered because the playing field at Mouldon is a great space, as well as offering ample parking for families who are unable to walk to the sessions. Moving the venue may mean other families who do not have access to a car may not be able to attend.

Due to the success, there will be another 6 weeks of sessions in September and Allstarz is trialling over 50's Walking Football Skills session to run alongside the secondary age football sessions. This will be open to men and women, which may also encourage couples to come along and give it a go. The intention of these sessions is to provide a gentle introductory fitness programme to the older demographic and to help reduce isolation within the community.

Finally, Gaynor Close Play Area was officially opened on Tuesday 26th July 2022. It was well attended by young people from Guides, Brownies and Rainbows. Doughnuts, sweets, and refreshments were provided.
