Reason for application (please continue on another sheet if necessary)	We regularly attend local events such as school fairs, community days, and markets to connect with residents, offer information and support, and fundraise through small sensory products such as fidget toys. These events are vital in helping us build visibility, promote wellbeing, and ensure people in need know they are not alone. To date, all of our outreach setup — including tables, chairs, and display boards — has been self-funded by our trustees. While this has enabled us to build momentum, we are now seeking the Council's support for a branded 3m x 3m gazebo and accompanying pop-up materials, which will allow us to

significantly enhance our community presence.

Why this investment matters

- **Increased visibility:** A branded gazebo makes it easier for residents to find and approach us at busy local events, improving access to support and information.
- **Weather protection:** Ensures we can attend events year-round, regardless of weather conditions, with a safe, sheltered space for volunteers and visitors.
- **Sustainability:** This reusable, high-quality equipment will reduce future costs and reliance on personal trustee contributions.
- **Alignment with local goals:** Our work supports inclusion, mental wellbeing, and community engagement — priorities we know align with the Council's vision for a strong, connected parish.

Accessibility and Inclusion

The Roxi Foundation is committed to ensuring that all of our community engagement efforts — including this gazebo and display project — are open, accessible, and welcoming to everyone. Our stall will be designed to create an inclusive space where individuals and families of all backgrounds and abilities feel comfortable to approach, ask questions, and access support.

While our core focus is on supporting families affected by neurodiversity, mental health challenges, and social isolation, our outreach is not limited to any one group. We provide information, resources, and a friendly face to anyone in the community who may benefit — whether they are seeking support, looking to learn more, or simply curious about what we do.

Key elements of our approach include:

- **Inclusive design:** The gazebo setup will be thoughtfully arranged with clear signage, wide access points, and seating options to accommodate different needs.

- **Sensory-friendly elements:** Where possible, we include calm zones, sensory items, and quiet activities to support neurodivergent visitors and their families.
- **Community presence:** By attending a wide range of public events — including those in underserved or rural areas — we aim to reach people who might not otherwise encounter support services.
- **Non-judgmental environment:** We pride ourselves on creating a safe, welcoming atmosphere where visitors feel seen, respected, and understood.

Through this project, we are enhancing not just our visibility, but also the quality and accessibility of the interactions we have with the public. It is central to our mission that no one feels excluded — whether they're stopping by for a chat, seeking resources, or discovering us for the first time.

This investment will directly benefit the people of Haydon Wick and surrounding areas by enabling The Roxi Foundation to have a consistent, visible presence at more local events throughout the year. With the new gazebo and branded materials, we will be better equipped to attend school fairs, parish fetes, community days, and local markets — whatever the weather — without relying on borrowed or personal equipment. By expanding our ability to attend events in Haydon Wick and nearby communities, we can:

- Raise awareness of our support services for families and individuals affected by neurodiversity, mental health challenges, or social isolation.
- Connect directly with local residents who may not otherwise know about us, ensuring they feel seen, supported, and part of the wider community.
- Offer resources and information at no cost to visitors, helping them access advice and signposting them to other relevant services.
- Strengthen community ties by working alongside local schools, community groups, and the Parish Council to promote wellbeing and inclusion.

	In short, this funding will allow us to reach more people in Haydon Wick and surrounding areas, more often, with a high-quality, welcoming stall that residents can easily find and approach. It will help us build trust, foster conversations, and ensure no one in the community feels alone.
